



WHAT IS YOUTHPASS?

Youthpass is a dynamic process that helps you increase the learning value of your project. It is a tool to document and recognise learning outcomes from youth work. It is a certificate; a special one as it includes your reflection, evaluation and your own words about what you have learnt during your project.

WHY USE YOUTHPASS?


When you use Youthpass during your project, you don't only receive a certificate of participation; you also have the chance to explain your learning and the competences you have developed in a written form and you improve the quality and visibility of your project.

Being more aware of your competences will make it easier to use them in your future personal and professional life and to communicate them better to others.

WHO CAN RECEIVE A YOUTHPASS CERTIFICATE, AND WHO IMPLEMENTS THE YOUTHPASS PROCESS?

All of your project team members can receive a Youthpass and you are the ones who implement the Youthpass process by taking the time for learning reflection individually and as a team. However, it may be good to consider if there are people who support you in your project and who could also help you and your team to reflect on your learning.



WHEN AND HOW TO WORK ON YOUTHPASS?

Youthpass process is followed throughout the project lifecycle.

IN THE PLANNING and preparation phases, it is a good idea to get more familiar with Youthpass, its structure and the website where the certificates are issued. Many people find it useful to define their learning goals and objectives at this stage and to make a learning plan – to consider what would help them achieve a certain goal and whom to ask for help along the way. Such a learning plan is personal and it can vary - even within the same project team - as it is based on one's own needs and plans for the future.

WHILE IMPLEMENTING your project, it is important to regularly reflect on how and what you are learning and in what ways you are reaching your learning objectives. Recording your learning by keeping a diary, making videos, drawings or other methods that work for you will help you keep track and remember. It is a good idea to plan these reflection moments in different ways; at certain moments you may want to discuss with another member of your team, at other times you prefer to be alone, sometimes you can reflect as a whole team or with a coach. Like this, you can describe your learning from different points of view and the outcome may be richer.

TOWARDS THE END of the project and **DURING THE FOLLOW-UP** phase, you can write your learning outcomes for the Youthpass certificate. Like that they can be useful for you also in the future; for your personal documentation or for presenting the certificate to others – such as in a university application or a job interview.



HOW TO ISSUE YOUTHPASS CERTIFICATES?

To start issuing the certificates, please create an account on the Youthpass database for your team/project. You can invite the members of your team to insert their learning outcomes in the database. Then you can create the certificates for your team. You can also find many materials and ideas on the Youthpass website that guide you through the whole process.
